Trio

On Sunday 30th June the Trio campaign was launched. Trio stands for "The Responsibility Is Ours", referring to the need to support our Church financially. At present our Church is running at a loss and our small reserves (needed for emergencies) are being depleted. Work that we need to do to maintain our property is having to be put on hold. Inflation which has affected all our us also affects the life of the Church. We are all encouraged to prayerfully consider the level of our giving the Church and, if at all possible, to increase the amount we give each week or month. Benevolent fund

The benevolent fund collection at the communion service on **14 July** will be for **Action for Children**.

Action for Children protects and supports children and young people, providing practical and emotional care and support, ensuring their voices are heard, and campaigning to bring lasting improvements to their lives.

Its services bring support for families to every part of the UK. In 2022/2023, it helped 765,905 children, young people and families.

The work is wide reaching. It takes action in lots of ways, from running short breaks for disabled children to influencing government policy and advocating for young people. It works with local authorities, and partners with the NHS and other agencies.

80% of the children and young people it helps do better after accessing its services, which include:

Children's centres and nurseries, supporting children through key milestones in speech, language and physical coordination. The staff give children the best start in life through play, learning and personal development. It offers classes and tailored individual support for parents, too. The services make sure young people and families get help early. It steps in to stop problems from building up, and helps to overcome obstacles.

Fostering and children's homes, finding safe and stable homes for vulnerable children, offering foster carers high levels of training and support, and making sure children in care get the support they need. It is expert at matching children with the right foster family, meaning its breakdown rates are very low. The families follow a therapeutic approach, giving young people a nurturing environment to grow in. There are family style homes for young people who have faced trauma early in life. Skilled staff give them practical and emotional support, so they can build resilience and form lasting relationships. There are also children's homes across the UK for children and young people with disabilities.

Policy influence, speaking up for children and young people, to influence MPs and the government to prioritise their needs. After four years of campaigning, sustained <u>emotional abuse is now a crime in England and Wales</u>. And Action for Children is proud that its work means children can now be recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.
