

Minister's Letter October 2024

Over the summer the congregation of Aigburth Methodist Church ceased to exist as a separate Methodist Society (Church).

The closing Service at Sara Hall, far from being a sad occasion, was a celebration of all that had been achieved for God over the years since meetings had started in 1872 in a small house in what was then the small village of Aigburth.

Many things in life exist in waves and cycles, with things starting small, flourishing and later becoming small again. This is reflected in the annual cycles of nature. In the spiritual life of the Christian Church things take longer than a year to complete a cycle.

As we pray for and hope for growth it is nevertheless clear that the Methodist and United Reformed Church in the UK is in an overall cycle of reduction at present. Numbers are not nearly as big as what they once were and it is harder than ever to find people who wish to take on responsibility within the Church. This is not a criticism, just a fact of life, often the result of ageing, weariness and conflicting responsibilities elsewhere.

However, even with declining numbers and a sense of weariness we still have great people and physical resources!

As we look at St James and around our Circuit, we see that there are many opportunities for us to offer our premises to serve the local community. These buildings are a resource which have passed down to us by those who sacrificially built them to serve God's purpose in our local community. May we not fall into the temptation to see them merely as a means to raise money!

Our resources in terms of people are you and I, each other and all of us together. Maybe we, like the Methodists of Aigburth village in 1872, need to begin again with smaller numbers and a realistic vision for what we can do together with our brothers and sisters in Christ in South Liverpool. Are we the small seeds which must be scattered in order that something new can grow and be harvested in the future?

One thing we can be sure of is that with Jesus there is always the offer of new, resurrection life.

Right at the end of the Bible (Revelation chapter 21 verse 5) John hears God's voice declaring "I am making everything new".

As we approach harvest Festival, we can be confident that the Lord of the Harvest has the miraculous power to make what we plant to grow even to a hundredfold!
