

Benevolent Fund

The benevolent fund collection at our communion service on 27 October will be for the Marie Curie charity.

Marie Curie provides expert hospice care and supports patients to be comfortable, free of pain and other symptoms, and able to live the best life they can to the end. It also supports a patient's loved ones in person or over the phone and pushes for a better end of life for all by campaigning and sharing research to change the system. Marie Curie provides free information and support about dying, death and bereavement, from first questions after a terminal diagnosis, or information about accessing services, to experiences shared by carers, guidance on planning for death, and support for grief. The nurses, healthcare assistants and other healthcare professionals bring the nursing, clinical and emotional help patients need and also to the people close to them – from reassurance and practical information to letting them take a break. And companion volunteers offer free emotional and practical companionship for people at or approaching the end of life, and those close to them.

As friends will know, we have enjoyed a close and friendly relationship with the Liverpool Centre of Marie Curie (based in Speke Road, only a few yards from the Church) for many years, and we shall pass the proceeds of our collection into the Liverpool Centre.
