General Election

The Joint Public Issues Team, which is a body including the Methodist and United Reformed Churches has issued some helpful guidance for us at this time.

Their overall heading is "Love. Pray. Vote". Within Charity Commission law there are regulations which prevent Churches and Church leaders suggesting which way people should vote. We are all free to make our own choices and shouldn't be pressurised by others to vote in a certain way.

However, we are challenged to consider the important issues facing the UK at this time, and to examine the policies of the different parties in relation to these issues. Then we can prayerfully and lovingly cast our votes.

The Joint Public Issues Team have identified six important issues which they think that we as Christians should be concerned about.

These are:
 Poverty
 Asylum & Refugees
Environment & Climate Change
 Economy
 Peace & Conflict
 Politics
